When You've Lost

In a normal year in mid-March, 68 NCAA men's basketball teams and 64 women's teams and fans would start off hoping for the best. Sixty-seven (63) of them would have lost by this point. On the surface, they're losers, but it would be totally inaccurate deep down. After all, they would have grown, learned, invested themselves, etc. What is true in those kinds of tournaments certainly reflects a truth in so many other places in life of far more importance than basketball. In times like these, it feels like we all have lost....our bearings, our innocence, our invulnerability. Some of you have directly lost jobs. Some have had grades, plans, dreams and more fall apart. Is it possible, though, that something else/ more might also be taking place inside us at the same time, or as a result?

In a normal year, we also now would be journeying with Jesus to a string of stinging defeats: sleeping disciples, a betrayal by one of them, an arrest at night, abandonment, two trials where he was found guilty, denial by Peter, a humiliating walk to his execution, mocking by all kinds of on-lookers, and finally his death. (Talk about a big-time loser!) And yet something else/more is taking place....

Even though the words, "If you really are the Son of God, come down from the cross!" are the world's final judgment of Jesus' failure (and a virus of our mortality), we are struck by some other words of his, such as "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Those are not words of "they won & we lost," but of God's (and our) victory in spite of loss. Those are words that a few days later were followed by an angel's proclamation, "He is not here, he has been raised!" What Jesus' death and resurrection demonstrate in real life and real time is that in the long run, the forces of God's self-giving love and life will triumph over those of fear and death, including the coronavirus. Even in death, something else...

Wonderfully, the events and presence of that great loser/victor also lead to our ability to overcome our losses. We can lose our pretending all is well and see how God can give us authentic recovery and hope. We can lose our sin and guilt and be set free to live. Rather than retribution and punishment on top of our fears and failures, God can give us a vision for how we can wait for another day, another chance, another life. May God's Easter word of life be real for us al!!!!
