Maundy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper that Jesus had with his disciples. At this intimate meal, Jesus gave his disciples his most important commandment—to love one another. (The Latin word *mandare*, to command, gives us the term “Maundy Thursday.”)

We invite you to observe a meal in your own home on Thursday, April 9, from 6:00 – 7:00pm CDT. As you eat, know that you are joined by other members of the Peace family, united in the body of Christ. We’ll be emailing you a prayer you can use before and after the meal and some passages from Scripture that you can include as part of your observance. On our [Facebook page](#), we will also have video recordings of these readings, which you can use, if you wish.

Good Friday

Traditionally, on Good Friday, we hold a “darkest day of the year” service. We remember that tragedy as we await Jesus’ resurrection.

Pastor Dave will be delivering a special Good Friday reflection, which will be streamed on [Facebook](#). We’ll also be emailing you a short collection of texts from Scripture, which also will be read aloud by some members from Peace on Facebook.
