That neighbor then taught Sawdi to do the same and, with the help of a small loan, Sawdi purchased two lambs to raise. When prices were highest, she was able to sell the sheep, pay back her loan, and make a good profit that helped feed her family through the lean season — with enough left over to save for more sheep! This is just one example of how your gifts help not just one family, but entire villages escape hunger and poverty. With your gifts, you help create widespread, lasting change.
