Building assets in youth and community

Our asset this month is Positive Relationships. Here are some suggestions for how to help this asset happen at home, at school, in the community, and in church or public organization.

At home:

Give your children opportunities to spend time with other adults. Encourage your children to join groups, troops or teams. Write thank you notes to adults who positively interact with your children and get to know your children's friends.

Teachers at school:

Have an open-door policy for students who want to talk. Be available. Take time to ask students at least one question about themselves as often as possible. Don't consider it wasted time when teachers spend time talking with students. Occasionally eat lunch in the cafeteria with the students.

In the community:

Create opportunities for youth and adults to work and play together.

In the church or public organization:

Have youth-involved programs where teens both participate and help lead. Create/publicize places kids can go after school and on weekends where caring adults and other kids can be safe and available. Do service projects, retreats, team building, etc., that are beyond the normal schedule.
