BECAUSE OF YOU AND YOUR GIFTS

"Something is wrong with me! I don't know what it is. Something is wrong with me!"

Carlendia had already been concerned about her daughter, Andrea's behavior, and when she broke down emotionally at the doctor's office, they were sent straight to the emergency room.

"My daughter at a very young age was experiencing difficulties at school. Her grades were not good at all ... Every task that I tried to give her, she could never complete it. Simple as making her bed – she'd take all day to do it." Their trip to the ER confirmed Andrea's claim that something was wrong: she was diagnosed with depression and a bipolar disorder. Today, one in five children through age 18 has a diagnosable mental health disorder. One in ten children has a mental health problem severe enough to impair how they function at home, in school, or in the community. Andrea is now an adult and doing well, but Carlendia hasn't forgotten how difficult those childhood days were. Mental illness is treatable, but only when families get the information and resources they need. Thank you for your generosity and compassion that allows Lutheran Social Services of Illinois to reach people like her!

The seminary has prepared these operating principles to help us help Vicar Mike have a good year!

- 1. The intern is in the parish to learn. The intern's role is often described as that of learner/server. The intern should be actively engaged in planning for learning experiences and continually engaging in reflection about new learnings.
- 2. An intern has only one supervisor. That supervisor is Pastor Dave. If you have any specific reflections, you are invited to share them with Pastor Dave! There will also be a committee to assist him throughout the year. We'll list their names on a bulletin board once the group gets going.
- 3. *Take time to see the intern as a person*. It is not only helpful but essential that you keep introducing yourself. It is hard to remember so many new names at once!
- 4. *Interns are not pastors*. Before the year is over, the intern will begin to think and function very much like a pastor. But don't expect experienced "professional" performance from one who is still learning. Internship is an educational process and not a job description. It is helpful not to call the intern "pastor"; intern and vicar are acceptable titles.
