Our desire to have people read a common Bible passage is part of our Book of Faith effort. Each month we pick a passage, invite everyone to read it sometime that month, and then those who are willing, write down a sentence or two (or more if you'd like) about what you got out of the passage.

December's passage is: John 1:14-18

BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR ISAIAH 35: 1-10

Have you ever been away from home for an extended period of time? How did you feel as you started the journey back home? This text is telling of the return of the Israelites from exile in Babylon. The trip home would still be a difficult one having to trek 900 mile across Syrian desert. However, despite the difficulty of the journey, it will be a joyous occasion as they return home. This passage ends with "And the ransomed of the Lord shall return, and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away" (Isaiah 35:10). For the Israelites it was more than a homecoming, it was a reunification with God. They viewed the exile as punishment from God for breaking the covenant; and the return from exile was viewed as part of the restoration of the relationship with God.
