February's passage is: Deuteronomy 6:4-12

BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR MICAH 6:1-8

You may be familiar with the Bible verse "do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8). Often I see this verse on wall art, refrigerator magnets, and other home decor. What is occurring in this text prior to that phrase is imagery of a court hearing where God brings a suit against Israel, for failing to uphold their end of the covenants made with God. The hills, mountains and foundation of the earth serve as the jury. In a court case with God, we would all be found guilty of failing to uphold our end of the covenants. But the good news is that God does not want us to pay for our transgressions with "thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil" (Micah 6:7) or other sacrifices. Rather, God asks us to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God.
