EVERYBODY READ

Our desire to have people read a common Bible passage is part of our Book of Faith effort. Each month we pick a passage, invite everyone to read it sometime that month, and then those who are willing, write down a sentence or two (or more if you'd like) about what you got out of the passage. **February's passage is: Deuteronomy 6:4-12**

BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR ISAIAH 58:1-12

In this passage the Israelites had just returned from the exile. The text is critical of the Israelites self-serving religious practices while they were ignoring the issue of justice around them. The author calls the Israelites on their alternative motives, "Look, you serve your own interests in your fast day, and oppress all your workers" (Isaiah 58:3). The author continues by offering an alternative to their self-serving practice, "Is not this the fast I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?" (Isaiah 58:6). This text can serve as a reminder to us that our prayer and spiritual practices should not be self-serving. Rather, we should also take actions that strive for justice.
