Drive-in and Online Worship for July 4 & 5 - see instructions below, too

Please join us for this weekend's Drive-in Worship at 5:00pm on Saturday, July 4, (with <u>Facebook live stream</u> of the worship) and another Drive-in Worship option on Sunday, July 5, at 9:45am. Our <u>Facebook page</u> and <u>YouTube Channel</u> sites will have the worship recorded and available anytime after Saturday's worship. (You do not need to have a Facebook account to access this public page.) There will be some great music from Todd, special music on Sunday by Pete & Nathaniel Knutson, a hymn to which you can sing along (words included below this announcement, so be sure to print out the words) some liturgy, scripture readings (Zechariah 9:9-12, Romans 7:15-25a, & Matthew 11:16-19, 25-30), prayers and a sermon. Join in being together in God's name in your cars or electronically and share the worship post with others!

How the drive-in worship works

- * We have a low power FM transmitter, which allows us to have worship leaders be visible from under the front canopy and heard in each person's car via their car radio or an old-fashioned radio. It will be on channel 89.3.
- * We're asking people to enter the parking lot through the south (bank-end) of the Atrium Point

- complex via Schoolhouse Rd. All will be asked to leave via Rt. 30. Large trucks and large SUV's are asked to park in the third row; vans and regular SUV's in the second row, and sedans in the first row.
- * All vehicles should park facing the front entrance, with one vehicle for every two parking spaces. To help accomplish that, park on the line itself. Some of you might want to angle to get a better view of the front entrance. If row 2 can offset behind row 1 so you have a view that's less obstructed, that may help.
- * The church building is closed, to people need to stay in their cars! (No going to the bathrooms inside or spreading out on the lawn, for example.) The service should only be about 30-40 minutes, so we hope that will work out.
- * In order to keep people's safety in mind following the advice of the CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health, we will not be having communion at this time, nor will be have an offering. We will depend on people continuing to contribute online or by mail.

What is next for how we might worship safely together?

STARTING JULY 11 & 12

In celebration that in Illinois the next phase of groups of 50 will be allowed, we have the following plan in mind to maintain good practices for the sake of all (not to mention that Deacon Shari and Pastor Dave are both in the higher risk category.)

- * Add an outdoor worship option on Saturdays at 5:00 and Sundays at 9:45 (and possibly switching to 8:30 and 11:00 if needed). We will maintain an option for people to continue to drive in/see & listen/participate in the worship from their cars. One or more services also will be streamed/recorded each week.
- * Households would be required to socially distance from each other. We will have markings in the grass for individuals/households to be 10' apart.
- * Those worshiping outdoors can choose whether to bring a blanket or their own chairs.
- * Masks would be required when moving to or from the parking lot to the marked spots. (We will have spares if you don't have one or forget.)
- * Children would have to be with an adult at all times.
- * In case of bad weather, the service would switch to a drive-in only format.
- * Worship leaders would be set up at the far west end of the long sidewalk (where all the grass is available between the main building and the garage) in front of the door to the education wing, facing the parking lot, which again allows those who choose the drive-in option to see.
- * The worship would continue to be modified so as to last about 30 to 40 minutes. There would be no ushers or greeters or other worship assistants or communion for July 11 or 12. (We are investigating resuming some kind

of communion option for July 18 & 19.) Worshiping outdoors will allow us to sing! Offering baskets will be available, too.

- * Bathrooms would be open, but people would be encouraged to use them only if necessary, and social distancing would be required. The doors to the bathrooms and the building itself would be left open to eliminate having to touch them, and for the sake of knowing what kind of distancing/waiting is needed.
- * Why not move indoors? For one thing, we wouldn't be able to sing. For another, we would have to take reservations to limit the number, which means some might be excluded. Also, there would be a lot more cleaning to do between/after services. Furthermore, the CDC's guidelines still recommend outdoor worship whenever possible.

We meet on Wednesday mornings at 10:00 a.m. We will be looking at the Psalms (starting with Ps. 103 on July 8) and any version of the Bible you have will work. You don't need to know anything about the Bible to join this class! On July 15 we will backtrack just a bit to finish up our incomplete/interrupted ending to the book of Job. We wanted everyone to get a chance to come back on board before going back to Job for a week or two. For those who will be coming to the in-person version, we will have some requirements for distancing, etc. Be sure to let us know if you plan to come to the in-person version.

If you don't, we'll gratefully look it up so that you get credit! We will have the boxes available outside (weather permitting) for the outdoor worship services.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL - TWO OPTIONS FOR JULY 28 & 29

Our amazing Vacation Bible School planning crew is now into version 3 for this year's VBS. Here is a summary of the latest version! (There will be a few more parts and we'll share those with those who register.) On July 28 & 29 there will be a two-day version of VBS. On both dates there will be *OPTION 1:* an online version via Zoom at 3:00pm. The format will include a group silly song, a lesson, plus a "how to" for a craft you can do at home. The time online probably will be about 15 minutes, with another 10 minutes available afterward for kids to just hang around with other kids online if they want. This option is rain or shine.

Or, OPTION 2: an in-person version that will be very limited in number. You will sign up for a specific time slot, and you will need to have at least one parent/young adult with the child(ren), and who will be the hands on helpers (so don't wear "good clothes!") You can organize yourself into groups of no more than 5 if you have neighborhood kids/relatives you want to include with you, or you can sign up for just your family. Social distancing and wearing masks (you will provide those) will be built into this format, with kids being outside and moving from station to station. The format will include some things you will provide: a gallon ziploc-style gallon bag with a name on each, a sharpie marker, and (for best results) a white pillowcase or white t-shirt. We will have all the supplies to tie-dye, a lesson-time with a silly song, and more too. Each "group" will move through in about 20 minutes. We will have start times from 4:00pm and lasting until 5:40pm (so we're done by 6:00.) You will need to call the church office M-F, 9:00 to 11:30 am to reserve your spot, first come-first served basis, but no later than July 21. There will be no online registration for this. The cost for the in-person version would be a suggested donation of \$5 per child. If all the time slots are gone, you can still do the online version, of course, plus we'll put you on a waiting list. (There will be some more instructions for those who sign up given out when you do.)

We have an ongoing partnership with Santa Cruz Lutheran Church in Joliet. They have a food and resource pantry for people of their neighborhood who are hungry or in need. You can bring donations anytime and put them in the baskets on the floor heading into Fellowship Hall. The pantry is in need of the following specific items: cereal (all kinds), canned fruit, coffee (ground), creamers (powdered), hand soap (bar & liquid), disposable diapers, dish soap, toothpaste, juices.

What is the diakoniaTM program? diakoniaTM is a two-year process of spiritual formation and theological education for baptized members of the Lutheran Church. This process occurs in three basic ways:

- By thorough grounding in the classic seminary disciplines of practical, Biblical, systematic, and historical theology;
- By identifying particular skills and aptitudes in ministry and encouraging their use in the local parish and community; and
- By providing spiritual growth through worship, retreats, and a supportive community of fellow students, pastor-mentors, and instructors.
