Bible Background for 2 Corinthians 8:7-15

A summary for this passage could be “put up or shut up.” Paul’s language is much more gentle than that phrase. Yet he is inviting the Corinthians to participate in an offering to help the people of Jerusalem who were suffering because of a drought and famine. They had said previously that there were going to help. Now Paul is reminding them that their abundance is not for their own benefit alone. Even in being generous, of course, they will also receive a greater blessing. Times have not changed!

Over the course of a night, the stories of royalty, quarrelsome fairies, young lovers, and a troupe of aspirational players are woven into one enchanting tapestry backed by a vibrant score blending jazz, blues, rock, and 50’s doo wop. Shakespeare’s raucous humor and wondrous imagery makes it easy to see why this play has remained an audience favorite for more than four hundred years. Tickets have not gone on sale to the public yet, so we don’t know a price - guess \$50??? The play will be at the Courtyard Theatre on Navy Pier.

ALSO, GO-KART QUESTION

Some asked about the new indoor go-kart facility in Mokena. Ticket prices are \$20 + tax (+ an annual license of \$8 + tax) for a 14 lap race.
