"In the beginning was the Word, the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1:1). The "Word" refers to Jesus. Jesus was with God and Jesus was God. One of the points the Gospel makes in this section is that Jesus is truly and fully divine, and not a creation of God, but God himself.**

The power of food to bring people together is a foundational principle of Farming Hope, a Bay Area nonprofit organization that provides transitional employment and job training to people who are experiencing homelessness or poverty and those who were formerly incarcerated. Farming Hope is funded in part by your gifts through our church to ELCA World Hunger. Farming Hope trains its participants during a six-week program in which they work several days a week in the kitchen learning restaurant skills and one day a week in an urban garden learning about food production.
