BUILDING ASSETS IN OUR YOUTH AND COMMUNITY

The asset that we're focusing on this month is **Personal Power**. Some things we can do in the community are **1) Recognize and affirm young people who demonstrate good judgement; 2) Model personal power by voting, speaking out about issues that matter to you, and being a problem solver; 3) Involve youth in addressing youth issues and policies in the community.** This week's idea for our community is **train adults who work with youth to affirm their abilities and give them choices whenever possible.**
