BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR EXODUS 17:1-7

Moses's task of leading the Israelites is not an easy one. The Israelites in Exodus appear to do nothing but complain. In this text, they are complaining that they have no water and are questioning why they even left Egypt. God provides for both the Israelites and Moses. God provides water for the Israelites, and he does so in a way that instils the Israelites with more faith in Moses's leadership ability. These examples support a larger theme throughout Exodus that no matter the situation we find ourselves in God will provide.
