# Outdoor/Indoor/Drive-in/Online Worship for Nov. 7 & Nov. 8 (two changes coming)

Please join us for this weekend's Outdoor and Drive-in Worship (89.3 FM) at 5:00pm on Saturday, Nov. 7, (with <u>Facebook live stream</u> of the worship) and two indoor worship options on Sunday, Nov. 8, at 8:30 & 11:00am. Two changes are coming: 1) For the outdoor, we'll move farther north so that the worship leaders will be under the canopy, and those who want to be outdoors can position their chairs anywhere they would like on the small grass area or on the parking lot. [That change is because of the darkness due to the time change.] 2) For the indoor, in addition to the "bring your own bread/cracker" for communion, we will have pre-packaged wafers and gluten free wafers available on a table for you to pick up if you wish. (Eventually we will be adding a pre-packaged grape juice option, too, but those are on back order.) If you want to be physically at church on Sundays but don't want to come inside, you can come to the parking lot and bring your cell phone with you to see the service on Facebook live. Our Facebook page site continues to have the worship services recorded and available anytime. (You do not need to have a Facebook account to access this public page.) There will be some great music from Todd, special music, a hymn to which you can sing along outdoors or hum indoors (words included below this announcement, so be sure to print out the words) some liturgy, scripture readings (Amos 5:18-24, 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18, & Matthew 25:1-13), prayers, communion and a sermon. Please join in being together in God's name outside, in your cars, in the sanctuary or electronically and share the worship post with others! (In case of inclement weather, outdoor worship will only be the drive-in option.) If you want more details, search/look for "How will worship work" at the end of the document.

### Details for how we worship this weekend, including Sunday indoor worship

#### FOR EVERYONE COMING TO PEACE

\*Whether you drive-in or are outdoors or indoors, or even at home, we have a modified communion option. You can take a piece of bread or cracker with you to the service (or now **pick up an individually packaged wafer for the indoor worship**.) Pastor Dave will give the Words of Institution on behalf of all of us and invite us to take our bread/cracker at the same time and partake of this modified version of the Lord's Supper. When the back-order is filled, we will also be adding a pre-packaged wafer & grape juice option.

\* In order to keep people's safety in mind following the advice of the CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health, there will be a drop box if you wish to bring an offering with you. Otherwise, we will depend on people continuing to contribute online or by mail.

\* Bathrooms will be available, but people would be encouraged to use them only if necessary, and social distancing would be required. The doors to the bathrooms will be left open to eliminate having to touch them, and for the sake of knowing what kind of distancing/waiting is needed. Masks are required.

\* Households would be required to socially distance from each other. Because of the time change, we are relocating our worship location just a little farther north - under the main canopy. You may still sit

## outside, either on the small grass area or in the parking lot. Those who wish to remain in their cars may do so, of course.

\* Masks would be required if you get out of your car. (We have spare masks.)

\* Worship leaders will be under the front entrance canopy. For those who wish to stay in their cars, please space yourselves out, parking on top of a yellow line.

- \* We will have sound projection/speakers for all to hear, plus the FM channel (89.3.)
- \* The worship will last about 30 to 40 minutes. Worshiping outdoors allows us to sing!

#### **ONLINE OPTION CONTINUES**

\* We will continue to live-stream our worship. We plan each week to record both Saturday and Sunday. Assuming everything works, both will be available through our Facebook site.

#### **INDOOR WORSHIP RESUMES**

We have resumed limited indoor worship on Sunday mornings with two services: 8:30 and 11:00. What follows is the whole list of what our restrictions and requirements need to be to make indoor worship as safe as possible, and how we can all work together to make this happen. This is also on our website www.peacenewlenox.org within the newsletter for November.

After many, many conversations with a variety of people and the leadership of the Council, here is the plan (to be tweaked as necessary) for resuming indoor worship. Some of you would like there to be fewer (or no) restrictions, but churches are considered places of super-spreading, and we owe it to each other and to our community and nation to do everything we can to be as safe as possible. That is what Jesus would have us do! If you are at a higher risk, please use your own good judgment. **Live-streaming will continue**! If you have questions, please contact us (peacechurch@peacenewlenox.org or 815-485-5327.)

\* All indoor services will be limited in attendance to 50 people total in the sanctuary and no more than 20 in Fellowship Hall, which will have the video stream in it. There **will be a registration process** each week (via email and the phone 815-485-5327 or <u>peacechurch@peacenewlenox.org</u>) on a first come basis starting after noon each preceding Sunday. We will notify you that we received your email/call and whether you are one of the first 50/20.

\* **Masks will be required** from the time you leave your car until you get back in the car. If you forget yours, we will have spares. (Those who are less than 2 years old or those with special health issues are exempt.)

\* Temperatures will be taken on the way in, and names will be checked off both to match the sign-up list, as well as if we needed to do contact tracing. You may have to wait a little bit, with spacing between households. Come early, please.

\* There will be no congregational singing of a hymn, except by one worship leader who will be shielded from the congregation. You *can* hum along!

\* We will have pews marked off so that socially distanced spaces can be maintained. Of course, household units can stay together in their pew. An usher will be available to help guide people, filling in pews from the front of the sanctuary to the back, and at the end of service leaving from the back.

\* We won't be having nursery attendants, acolytes, refreshments, lay liturgists, lesson readers, etc.

\* Between services, the sanctuary and all other spaces will be electrostatically sprayed with a disinfectant that will cover all surfaces.

\* Bathrooms will be discouraged from being used but will also receive attention.

\* Drinking fountains will not be in use.

\* Communion now will be offered as "bring your own bread or cracker" and with a table in the entrance area on which we will have bags of individual wafers (regular and gluten free) spread out that you can take yourself on your way by.

\* The service length will continue to be between 30 and 40 minutes.

\* If you feel sick or have come in contact with someone who has COVID-19, please stay home and watch via the live-stream.

\* We are going to need volunteer ushers, temperature takers, and after worship sprayers. You can sign up on the website (Sign Up) or contact the office. These volunteers will need to provide a N95/KN95 mask for

themselves. There will be no physical contact with anyone, but the temperature takers will be within the six foot space for a few seconds.

Please pray for our world's healing, and for our congregation's ongoing attempts to stay faithful to God and God's leading!
