#### Good and Bad Conductors

When it comes to wanting electricity to flow, using silver and copper are smart choices. When it comes to cooking, the pans on top of the stove will always be metal of some kind – some "quick" like aluminum, and some "slow" like cast iron. But when it comes to holding on to a pot, or wrapping a wire where electricity is flowing, you don't want more metal. You want a poor conductor, like wood or plastic.

Human beings are conductors, too. The Gospel of God made known in Jesus invites us to be good conductors, which has nothing to do with how well an electric current flows through us or how much heat we give off (or whether we keep time to music!) It has everything to do with how well the good news of God is transmitted. As you look around, it is easy to see bad conductors. Mercifully, the ads for candidates for elections will soon be over. The ratio of commercials where "the other person is a bum" compared to uplifting ones has to be 5:1. Positive leadership seems to be lacking on the national scene. Local news has its own share of people who are out to hurt, fleece, exclude, denigrate others. Those are not conducting what God wants.

So, let's concentrate on some great conductors, instead. Take the work of ELCA's World Hunger and Disaster Appeal ministries. All over the world they are (on our behalf and with your support), providing sustainable food programs, education, dignity, hope, and so much more. In this month, another amazing effort will be made by people in this congregation to provide a Thanksgiving dinner, provide warm coats, provide candy to soldiers, provide ministry to nursing homes, provide gifts to children, and more. You will listen to people who need a caring ear; you will snuggle children and soothe their wounds and worries; you will encourage the discouraged; and more.

I will give thanks this month for you and the witness of so many people in this congregation and throughout the world who have allowed God's love and forgiveness and mercy to flow through them – it makes a huge difference. We can't make someone else into a good conductor, but we ourselves can be "silver" and not "wood"!

#### In the community:

Offer workshops for parents on ways to establish boundaries, address problem behavior and enforce consequences. Create tip sheets for parents on fair and effective discipline strategies.

#### In the church or public organization:

Set and enforce clear expectations for the behavior of youth in your group. Educate young people about how to set boundaries for themselves.
