Our desire to have people read a common Bible passage is part of our Book of Faith effort. Each month we pick a passage, invite everyone to read it sometime that month, and then those who are willing, write down a sentence or two (or more if you'd like) about what you got out of the passage. November's passage is: Psalm 103:1-14

#### **BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR LUKE 6:20-31**

What do we live for? The beatitudes are an often quoted set of sayings of Jesus. The beatitudes appear in both the Gospel of Matthew and the Gospel of Luke. What makes Luke's account unique is each of the four beatitudes also has a corresponding woe. For example, the first beatitude "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God" (6:20b) corresponds with "But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation" (6:24). The blessings being juxtaposed to the woes serves a reminder to us that we are not to be content through only satisfying out physical needs, because our physical satisfactions are temporary. Instead, this text reminds us that we live for the Kingdom of God and our rewards of heaven and eternal life will be permanent.
