November's passage is: Psalm 103:1-14

#### **BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR 2 THESSALONIANS 3:6-13**

Have you heard the saying "don't anticipate, participate," this was a typical response I got when growing up if I asked a question about what we would do next? Paul in his second letter to the Thessalonians is telling his audience the exact same thing, "don't anticipate, participate." There was a group within the Christian community at Thessalonica that was not contributing to society. Paul wrote to address this laziness urging them to follow his example, "for you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you." (2 Thessalonians 3:7) One hypothesis for why this group was idle is that they were so confident the second coming of Christ would happen soon that they stopped living normal lives. They figured there was no point to working today if Christ was coming back tomorrow. Paul urged them to be active participants in the community, and to continue to do what is right, regardless of what might come tomorrow.
