A Yield Sign

Of the traffic signs you need to know for a driver's license exam, in my opinion two of the easiest to recognize are the stop and yield signs. Their shapes are unique and their colors, too. The former indicates we're supposed to come to a complete stop – which has become a rolling stop for many – and the latter, which means someone else has the right away and you're supposed to let them go ahead of you.

In everyday life, we don't like those experiences. When illness or something else means we have to stop, many of us can't wait to get going again. When it comes to yielding, all of us who like to be in control and maybe even in charge don't want to yield to a different path or opinion. In a divided nation, the thought of compromising (or worse, yielding), makes some people's skin crawl.

Is it any wonder that when the Bible talks about yielding our spirits to God, these days that word seems like a foreign language at best, and out of touch at worst.

When and how might the truth of yielding have value and importance for us? When and how is it not a sign of weakness, but such a life-enhancing option that it brings one benefit after another? Certainly, one place it has shown up over and over again is with addictions. "Let go and let God!" is a reality that has saved countless lives. Another example is when our own stubbornness has brought conflict. Can we see how even a degree of yielding might bring down the temperature? To yield your time for a friend who needs a listening ear is a gift. To live with an attitude of grace (God's love freely given shaping our lives) imparts peace to our own self and to others. When life brings unwanted changes, what can you change and fix and what can't you? Yielding to what is brings peace. In God's eyes yielding does not mean to just give up or give in. It is a thoughtful gift that looks to how God can bless the situation.

Drive-in and Online Worship Continue – plus indoor to resume (see next page)

Please join us for Drive-in Worship (FM 89.3) at 5:00pm on Saturdays (with <u>Facebook live stream</u> of the worship on) and another Drive-in Worship option on Sundays, at 9:45am for Oct. 4 & 11. For Our <u>Facebook page</u> and <u>YouTube Channel</u> sites will have the worship recorded and available any time after Saturday's worship. (You do not need to have a Facebook account to access this public page.) There will be some great music from Todd and a hymn to which you can sing along (words included in the bulletin so be sure to print out the words) some liturgy, scripture readings, prayers and a sermon. Join in being together in God's name in your cars or electronically and share the worship post with others!

Communion Option Added

FOR EVERYONE

* We're asking all people to enter the parking lot through the south (bank-end) of the Atrium Point complex via Schoolhouse Rd. All will be asked to leave via Rt. 30. If you are doing the outdoor option, we would ask you to park anywhere to the northern half of the parking lot, out of the line of sight of the worship platform and walk to the grass area. For those doing the drive-in option, park facing the long sidewalk anywhere so you can see, and do the everyother-space routine, parking on the line. (Sedans in the row closest to the grass, and other sized vehicles starting in row 2.)

*Whether you drive-in or are outdoors, or even at home, we are adding a modified communion option.

Take a piece of bread or cracker with you to the service.

Pastor Dave will give the Words of Institution on behalf of all of us and invite us to take our bread/cracker at the same time and partake of this modified version of the Lord's Supper.

* In order to keep people's safety in mind following the advice of the CDC and Illinois Department of Public Health, there will be a drop box if you wish to bring an offering with you. Otherwise, we will depend on people continuing to contribute online or by mail.

* Bathrooms will be available, but people would be encouraged to use them only if necessary, and social distancing would be required. The doors to the bathrooms and the building itself would be left open to eliminate having to touch them, and for the sake of knowing what kind of distancing/waiting is needed. Masks are required.

ONE OPTION: OUTDOOR WORSHIP

* Households would be required to socially distance from each other. We have markings in the grass for individuals/households about 10' apart.

* Those worshiping outdoors can choose whether to bring a blanket or their own chairs.

* Masks would be required when moving to or from the parking lot to the marked spots. (We will have spare masks if you don't have one or forget.)

* Children would have to be with an adult at all times. * Worship leaders would be set up at the far west end of the long sidewalk (where all the grass is available between the main building and the garage) in front of the door to the education wing, facing the parking lot, which again allows those who choose the drive-in option to see.

* We will have sound projection/speakers for all to hear. * The worship would continue to be modified so as to last about 30 to 40 minutes. There would be no ushers or greeters or other worship assistants. Worshiping outdoors will allow us to sing!

* In case of bad weather, the service would switch to a drive-in only format centered at the front entrance.

DRIVE-IN OPTION CONTINUES

* We have a low power FM transmitter, which allows us to have worship leaders be visible and heard in each person's car via their car radio or an old-fashioned radio. It will be on channel 89.3. You might be able to hear the outdoor loudspeakers, but we're not counting on that.

* Park so you can see the worship leaders at the end of the long sidewalk, or in case of bad weather, back to the area by the main entrance.

ONLINE OPTION CONTINUES

* We will continue to live-stream our worship. We plan each week to record both Saturday and Sunday. Assuming everything works, both will be available through our Facebook site.

* Why not move indoors? For one thing, we wouldn't be able to sing. For another, we would have to take reservations to limit the number, which means some might be excluded. Also, there would be many more restrictions and a lot more cleaning to do between/after services. Furthermore, the CDC's guidelines still recommend outdoor worship whenever possible. The history of re-openings in other states makes this issue even more current.

Coming Back Inside Starting Oct. 18

After many, many conversations with a variety of people and the leadership of the Council, here is the plan (to be tweaked as necessary) for resuming indoor worship on Oct. 18. Some of you would like there to be fewer (or no) restrictions, but churches are considered places of super-spreading, and we owe it to each other and to our community and nation to do everything we can to be as safe as possible. That is what Jesus would have us do! If you are at a higher risk, please use your own good judgment. **Live-streaming will continue**! If you have questions, please contact us

(<u>peacechurch@peacenewlenox.org</u> or 815-485-5327.)

* We will continue to have an outdoor/drive-in Saturday nights (& Facebook streaming) at 5:00 for as long as we can.

* Starting Oct. 18 (not this weekend), we will go back to having two services on Sunday, with one at 8:30am and one at 11:00am, both live-streamed as well.

* All indoor services will be limited in attendance to 50 people total in the sanctuary and no more than 20 in Fellowship Hall, which will have the video stream in it. There **will be a registration process** each week (via email and the phone 815-485-5327 or <u>peacechurch@peacenewlenox.org</u>) on a first come basis starting after noon on Sunday. We will notify you that we received your email/call and whether you are one of the first 50/20.

* **Masks will be required** from the time you leave your car until you get back in the car. If you forget yours, we will have spares. (Those who are less than 2 years old or those with special health issues are exempt.)

* Temperatures will be taken outside the main entrance on the way in, and names will be checked off both to match the sign-up list, as well as if we needed to do contact tracing. You may have to wait a little bit, with spacing between households. Come early, please.

* There will be no congregational singing of a hymn, except by one worship leader who will be shielded from the congregation. You *can* hum along!

* We will have pews marked off so that socially distanced spaces can be maintained. Of course,

household units can stay together in their pew. Ushers will be available to help guide people, filling in pews from the front of the sanctuary to the back, and at the end of service leaving from the back.

* We won't be having nursery attendants, acolytes, refreshments, lay liturgists, lesson readers, etc.

* Between services, the sanctuary and all other spaces will be electrostatically sprayed with a disinfectant that will cover all surfaces.

* Bathrooms will be discouraged from being used but will also receive attention.

* Drinking fountains will not be in use.

* Communion will continue to be "bring your own bread or cracker."

* The service length will continue to be between 30 and 40 minutes.

* If you feel sick or have come in contact with someone who has COVID-19, please stay home and watch via the live-stream.

* We are going to need volunteer ushers, temperature takers, and after worship sprayers. You can sign up on the website (<u>Sign Up</u>) or contact the office. These volunteers will need to provide a N95/KN95 mask for themselves. There will be no physical contact with anyone, but the temperature takers will be within the six foot space for a few seconds.

This is why Jesus talks so much about community! This is why Jesus says wherever 2 or 3 are gathered in my name, I am there. When we are in community, we are stronger, happier, and more at peace.
