Water the Flowers

In terms of rain, we have entered another dry spell (at least at the time I'm writing this.) For all of us who have outdoor flowers, just about the time we thought we could put the hose on background status, along comes the question of watering the plants. (We know perfectly well that if you water the flowers, you're also giving water to the weeds, which do not seem to care if there's rain or not.)

I saw an anonymous quote from the Hazelden organization the other day that uses those images as a metaphor for how our lives go sometimes: "Stop watering the weeds in your life and start watering the flowers." It makes perfect sense to stop watering the weeds, right? And yet we spend a lot of our time watering our weeds. You probably know very well which weeds you've watered in your life. How about behaviors that are counter to what you want, and yet you hang around them and keep them close at hand (almost setting yourself up to keep doing them)? Or how about the amount of time we spend reliving our mistakes? Or how about how sometimes we are consumed by worry (and then worry about our worrying?) Negative thoughts and negative people are allowed an inside track to our brain, and the opinions are dismissed of people who would point out the irrationality of some of that thinking. The result? Weeds are watered.

Why not follow God's lead and water the flowers! What if you taught yourself to match every negative thought about yourself (or someone else or something else), with a positive one? What if the critique of someone toward us were a trigger to accept what's true in what was said, without making it universally true-in-all cases? One way to avoid watering the weeds is to get rid of them. Another way is to so overwhelm the weeds with flowers, they don't have room to grow and spread.

The goal in all this is not to be naïve or blind to the weeds in the world or our own lives. The goal is to minimize watering the weeds, and to augment, notice & celebrate how God looks at us and sees flowers first! Forgiveness, new life, self-giving are some great ways to water the flowers.
