Crawling through Life

When we were babies, there was a point when people got all excited because we started to crawl. Some of you were speed-demons on four “legs.” Some of you crawled to where you wanted to go, and then could pull yourself up for a moment before you were back on all fours. The goal, of course, was to walk, but crawling did the trick for a while.

Sometimes as kids or adults, we crawl again. Have you been to an amusement-type obstacle set up? To get through that tube in order to get to the next station, you have no choice but to crawl. In the military’s basic training, keeping your head and body down is essential to not getting shot! In some of your homes there are attics and crawl spaces that do not allow you to stand up.

What happens, though, when crawling becomes a way of life? I don’t have in mind literally moving on our hands and knees, but creeping along in life or dragging our lives along or never feeling as though we can stand up, much less walk or run. And what does this kind of crawling look like? It looks like anxiety or worry. It looks like too busy to enjoy life or to pay attention to the people who matter to us. It looks like despair and way too much pressure and inability to accomplish our goals. We keep waiting for that next thing to be done so we can relax....and it never happens because each thing is replaced by something else.

Many people are crawling through life because they never learned how to walk with a supportive Presence alongside them. They have bought into a false line that says it’s all up to you (alone.) It is exhausting to crawl through life that way. When we learn how to rely on God to help us with all the things that would keep us crawling, we are amazed at how we can stand up, and even walk and sometimes run, in spite of those obstacles. God’s supportive presence looks like self-giving, looks like forgiveness, looks like hope, looks like second-chances, looks like priority setting, looks like letting go. We are so grateful to God for these kinds of gifts that help lift us up day after day!

Building assets in youth and community

At school:

Expect students to act responsibly. Notice and affirm them when they do; set clear and reasonable consequences for when they don't.

In the community:

Challenge the assumptions that youth are irresponsible. Make responsibility a community value.

In the church or public organization:

Develop skits or stories to help teach younger kids about honesty. Support youth when they're in situations where it's difficult to carry out their responsibilities.

Carlenia had already been concerned about her daughter, Andrea's behavior, and when she broke down emotionally at the doctor's office, they were sent straight to the emergency room. Their trip to the ER confirmed Andrea's claim that something was wrong: she was diagnosed with depression and a bipolar disorder. Today, one in five children through age 18 has a diagnosable mental health disorder. One in ten children has a mental health problem severe enough to impair how they function at home, in school, or in the community.
