### **BIBLE BACKGROUND FOR PHILEMON 1:1-21**

The Epistle to Philemon is a short book in the New Testament. It is only 25 verses. The letter from the Apostle Paul to Philemon, a Christian in Colossae, is unique to the letters written by Paul. It does not deal with church matters or theology, but rather a personal matter. The subject of the letter is Onesimus, likely a runaway slave, who found his way to Paul. Paul converts Onesimus to Christianity and is sending Onesimus and the letter to Philemon, his master, in the hopes that Philemon will free Onesimus. The letter pleads that Onesimus be viewed "no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a beloved brother." (Philemon 1:16) Paul offers to pay any debts Onesimus has. Throughout the letter, Paul models how in all situations we should conduct ourselves with integrity.

There is great freedom in exploring our faith lives without any pressure to know anything. Plus the go around questions are an easy way to get to know others.

### **OUESTIONS KIDS ASK ABOUT GOD UPDATE**

One of the questions for August from our amazing kids was "Is God rich?" Overwhelmingly YES! Only it is not just because God already owns everything in the whole universe. It is because God wants to share everything, including God's love, with everyone. What makes God rich is not what God has, but what God does with it all. Being generous can make us all rich, no matter how much "stuff" we can claim as ours.
